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BALTIMORE CHORAL ARTS ANNOUNCES MUSIC DIRECTOR ANTHONY BLAKE CLARK'S INAUGURAL 2017-18 SEASON

Baltimore Choral Arts' new Music Director Anthony Blake Clark launches his inaugural 2017-18 season with a mix of well-known choral masterworks as well as unfamiliar gems.

The Choral Arts season opens on Saturday, October 28, 2017 with Blake Clark conducting the symphonic chorus and orchestra in popular works by Bach, Haydn, and Randall Thompson, which portray themes of war and immigration. The concert also features Handel's *Dixit Dominus*, known for its brilliant, virtuosic setting.

Baltimore Choral Arts continues its tradition of holiday offerings as Blake Clark conducts the full chorus and orchestra in *Christmas with Choral Arts* in the Baltimore Basilica on Tuesday, December 5, 2017. This year's *Sing-Along Messiah*, led by Blake Clark on Friday, December 15, 2017, features the Choral Arts chamber chorus in the full-length work, and offers the audience the opportunity to sing the choruses from Handel's magnificent *Messiah*. *Christmas for Kids* features Pepito the Clown, and offers holiday fun for the whole family on December 16, 2017.

The season closes on Sunday, May 6, 2018 with Blake Clark conducting Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms* in honor of composer Leonard Bernstein's 100th birthday, as well as the original version of Duruflé's *Requiem*, featuring internationally-acclaimed organist Jeremy Filsell, and showcasing the magnificent organ in the historic St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

The third Music Director in Baltimore Choral Arts' 51-year history, conductor and composer Anthony Blake Clark has led ensembles in the United States and Europe, and his compositions have been heard across the country as well as in the UK, and the Czech Republic. Blake Clark has conducted the London Classical Soloists, and he was employed by the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra (CBSO) to conduct the Arts Champion Community Choir as part of an initiative to create a CBSO-sponsored community chorus. A Texas native, Anthony Blake Clark received his Bachelor's degree in composition and conducting from Baylor University School of Music, and completed his Master's degree in conducting, studying with Simon Halsey and Julian Wilkins at the University of Birmingham, England.
