will offer paid summer internships to 25 rising seniors from Baltimore City Public High Schools. This new internship program will build strong career skills while providing:

- meaningful work experience and special projects in arts administration through a placement at an arts/cultural institution
- behind-the-scenes tours and presentations at arts organizations
- the chance to see/hear/talk about works of art in various arts disciplines, including art, music, theatre, dance, design, film/video, technology
- guidance and support with college applications



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ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP

The Bloomberg Arts & Culture Internship program is designed to challenge and inspire students. As an intern, you will work at your internship worksite three days per week. On the fourth day, you will participate in field trips to cultural institutions, and on the fifth day, you will participate in professional development, college prep workshops and writing coaching sessions.

Interns can expect to develop work plans, start a college application, create personal essays, write responses to art and performances, complete a final project and, most of all, be challenged.

Interns are paid \$9.25 per hour for 35 hours per week for the six-week internship plus an additional 20 hours during the orientation week—a total of 230 hours from June 20-August 4, 2017.

ELIGIBILITY

To apply, students must be enrolled in a Baltimore City public high school and:

- -Successfully complete junior year in 2016-17
- -Be 16 years of age or above by June 15, 2017
- -Have a passion for the arts
- -Commit to attend the 35-hour/week internship plus 20 hours of orientation (June 20-23)
- -Commit to working full-time for 6 weeks from June 26-August 4
- -Be able to work legally in the U.S.





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APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1

Submit an application online at

You must fully complete all sections of the application and include all required supporting materials, including grades, attendance, and recommendations from teachers.


Step 2

Only a certain number of students who submit applications will qualify for Step 2.

If you are selected to move to the next step of the process, you will be invited by YA and GBCA to participate in an interview. You will be notified by YA/GBCA if you are invited for an interview. At that time you will receive information about how to prepare for the interview, as well the appointment date, time, and location. Interviews will take place during the week of April 17-21, 2017.

Step 3

Based on the strength of applications and interviews, 25 students will be selected to participate in the program. If you are selected as one of the 25 members of Baltimore's first Class of 2017 Bloomberg Interns, you will be notified
