# HANDEL CHOIR OF BALTIMORE ANNOUNCES 2017–2018 SUBSCRIPTION CONCERT SEASON

Subscription tickets available now

(Baltimore, MD) Handel Choir's 2017–2018 subscription concert series highlights the late 19th- and mid-20th-century Requiems by Fauré and Duruflé, with guest artist Jeremy Filsell on organ, and the Mass for Double Choir by 20th-century Swiss composer Frank Martin, along with the Choir's 83rd annual presentation of Handel's *Messiah: An Oratorio*.

"Quite simply, it's a season of some of the most gorgeous choral music in the canon written by the masters," said Arian Khaefi, Handel Choir's artistic director and conductor, "with one or two lesser known gems added to the mix for flavor."

Handel Choir performs *Messiah* with period instrument orchestra and acclaimed vocal soloists at 7:30 p.m. Saturday December 9, 2017, and 3 p.m. Sunday December 10, 2017, at Grace United Methodist Church in the Homeland neighborhood of Baltimore and at St Mark Catholic Church in Catonsville, respectively. Frank Martin (1890–1974) composed his *a cappella* Mass for Double Choir in 1922, with revisions in 1926. He did not allow the piece to be performed until the early 1960s, however, viewing the work as "a matter between God and myself. Music critic Alex Ross has said Martin's composition "sounds like a Renaissance mass lost in time, aware nonetheless of long centuries passing and new horrors unfolding." The piece will close Handel Choir's second concert, which starts at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, March 3, 2018, at Second Presbyterian Church (Guilford), and which will also include sacred works by Handel, Mozart, Brahms and Mendelssohn.

The third and final concert of Handel Choir's subscription season, *Sérénité*, consists of the Fauré and Duruflé Requiems (written 1887–1890 and 1941–1947, respectively) performed back to back. Handel Choir is joined by organist Jeremy Filsell, whose playing has been called "stunning" and "flawless," among many other accolades. The concert takes place at 7:30 p.m. Saturday April 21, 2018, at Second Presbyterian Church (Guilford).

A pre-concert lecture takes place one hour before each subscription concert and is open to all ticketholders.
